

## Facial Surgery Scars

### Laser-Erase Procedure Banishes Facial Surgery Scars

About 118,000 facelifts among thousands of other facial procedures are performed each year on patients seeking a more youthful appearance. Men and women alike spend tens of thousands of dollars to reverse the ravages of time. Where facelifts and eyelid surgery do produce a younger look, in most cases scars leave very prominent telltale signs of plastic surgery. Facelift and eyelid scars have always been a dead giveaway and stigmata of facial surgery and a major deterrent for many patients considering facial rejuvenation. Finally a solution is upon us. Dr. Michael Evan Sachs, NYC's premier facial plastic surgeon known for inventing new and innovative cosmetic surgery techniques, shed some light on erasing facial surgery scars with the new Laser-Erase procedure.

Using an extremely thin line (pencil thin) of the CO2 Laser, Dr. Sachs, performs the Laser-Erase procedure about 2 weeks after facial surgery including facelifts, eyelid surgery or any other facial procedure that requires an incision. "The stitches stay in for one week, and a week after that, I simply erase the incision line with the laser," says Sachs. Going over the incision line with the laser in the very early stages of the healing process, actually disrupts a scar from forming. The Laser-Erase is a one-time only procedure, banishing incision lines from sight with a zap of the light.

Lately, many people have been shying away from facial rejuvenation for fear of scarring that may be worse than how he or she looked before surgery. Large thick scars can be unattractive as well as embarrassing for those who would like to keep their surgery a secret and count Mother Nature as blessing them with great genes. With Dr. Sachs' "Laser-Erase" procedure, scars may certainly become a problem of the past.
